The proposal was to purchase three units to not only upgrade the existing repeater in Parma, but to add a repeater in Brunswick and one in Shaker Heights to substantially increase the coverage of the system. The discussion at the meeting was inconclusive and another motion was made to allow the Board of Directors to approve the expenditure since the promotion would end before the next regular meeting. After much investigation and consideration, the Board approved the expenditure at a special meeting. The upgrade is now in the works. So in the near future the C.A.R.S. repeater system will now have digital, as well as analog, capabilities plus a much improved coverage area to the East, South and West. Hats off to the technical committee led by Mike, KD8OUE, and members Mark, WJ8WM, Vince, N8OVW, and Eddie, KD8FTS. With the dramatic upgrade to the system, the club will be promoting members take advantage of the repeater upgrade by getting more hams involved in it's usage. The nets are usually popular, but there are many members who have the capability to participate, but for whatever reason, are not heard on Wednesday nights. There will also be meeting programs to

help members become more familiar with their equipment so they can become more "radio active." Programs will also offer training in various operating procedures and station set-up and improvement. We will also be stressing the use of the repeaters at the meetings in an attempt to get more member involvement.

Don't forget the October meeting will be a dinner meeting at the FUGI Grill & Buffet located at 1930 Snow Rd. in Parma in the Midtown shopping center. As an exciting bonus, C.A.R.S. will pick up the tab for all members attending. That's FREE folks. The room is reserved for 6:00 so we can eat before we start the meeting at 7:30. 
